## ICSE/ISC:

A typical school day is from 8:15 a.m. to 2:15 p.m. (Monday to Thursday) and till 3:15 p.m. on Fridays for all students.

## Assessment Criteria & Reporting

Students are evaluated following the systematic format of Formative and Summative assessments. Student learning is measured on an ongoing basis through regular cycle tests, term examinations and internal assessments. Formal examinations are introduced in Grade VIII.

**The ISC board examination (national-external) begins in February.**

Academic reporting is in accordance with the standards outlined by the CISCE (in percentage). The same grading system applies to the predicted scores.

### School Policy on College Applications:

**Predicted grades:** These are not based on any single examination. They are generated on the basis of algorithm as follows:

Grade X Board marks	: <b>25%</b>
Grade XI Cumulative scores of both terms	: <b>20%</b>
Grade XII Term I or II examination	: <b>40%</b>
Teacher's (subject teacher) discretion	: <b>15%</b>

**The Initial Transcript** reports Term 1 marks of Grade XII, board marks of Grade X and cumulative final scores of Grades IX & XI.

The **Mid Year Transcript** reports the Grade XII Pre-board marks.

**The Final Transcript** reports the ISC board marks.

**Early Decision Policy:** If a student decides to undertake an Early Decision application, the school informs the student that if accepted it is mandatory to commit to that college/university.
